



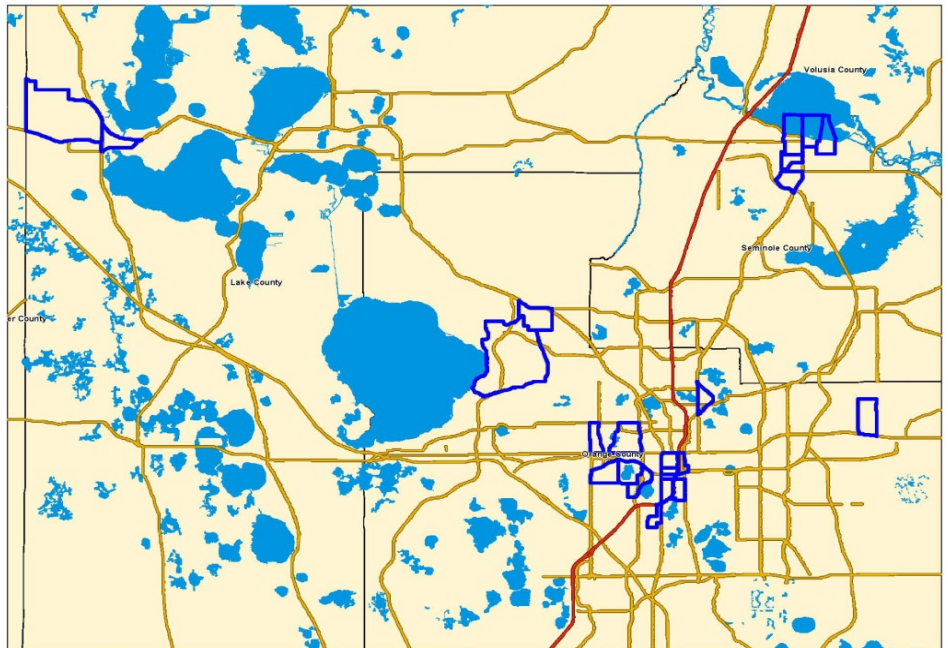
Historically Underutilized Business Zones (HUBZones) are urban/rural community or tracts of land with below average median income and/or above average unemployment that has been targeted for small business development. This program is administered by the United States Small Business Administration (SBA).

U.S. Small Business Administration



In order to qualify for the HUBZone program, a small business:

- Must have its principal office located in a "historically underutilized business zone" or HUBZone, including lands on federally recognized Indian reservations;
- Must be 51% owned by a US citizen(s). Additionally approved ownerships including Community Development Corporations, Indian Tribes and agricultural cooperatives;
- Must be a small business by SBA size standards, and
- At least 35% of employees
